BATTLEFIELDS & MONUMENTS

19. CANYON CREEK BATTLEFIELD NATIONAL MONUMENT

8 miles north of Laurel on Buffalo Trail
This walk-through display tells the history of the Canyon Creek Battle between the Nez Perce, led by Chief Joseph, and the U.S. Cavalry, led by Colonel Samuel Sturgis.

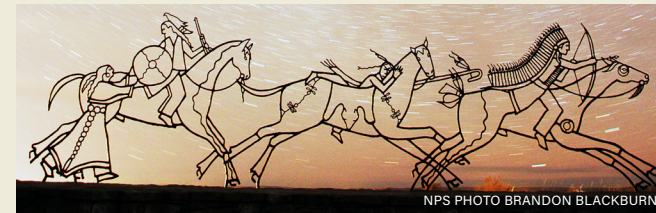
20. LITTLE BIGHORN BATTLEFIELD NATIONAL MONUMENT

Custer National Cemetery • Interstate 90 Frontage Road • Crow Agency
Studied perhaps more than any other battle on U.S. soil, the Battle of Little Bighorn stands as the Plains Indians' greatest victory over U.S. military forces. **NOTE:** The Little Bighorn Battlefield National Monument will undergo a major renovation, starting in 2024. 21. ROSEBUD BATTLEFIELD STATE PARK

Also known as the "Place Where the Girl Saved Her Brother," one of the largest of the Indian War battles took place here, just days before the Battle of the Little Bighorn.

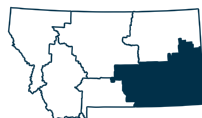


THE WARRIOR TRAIL

Between 1865 and 1877, as American Indian Tribes desperately tried to retain their lands and culture, and the soldiers of the U.S. Army strove to enforce an edict from Washington, D.C., many battles of great historical significance marked this corridor. This stretch of the highway has been officially designated as the Warrior Trail and runs along Highway 212 from Belle Fourche, South Dakota to Crow Agency, Montana.

PURPLE HEART TRAIL

Chartered by Congress in 1958, The Military Order of the Purple Heart is composed of military men and women who received the Purple Heart Medal for wounds suffered in combat. This designated trail commemorates and honors the Military Order of the Purple Heart and, in Southeast Montana, runs along Interstates 94 and 90. A Purple Heart Memorial is located adjacent to the Yellowstone County Courthouse in Billings.
